 - Thoughts about students who might not want to participate in a conversation about race at all?
 - Levels of comfort for students and staff may vary.
 - The difference between feeling uncomfortable and being unsafe.
 - Listening with resilience How do we help students build the skills necessary to not only have an opinion, but listen to others as well and be flexible enough to shape their opinion based on new information.
 - How to have those difficult conversations:
 - Being a critical thinker.
 - How to listen to someone else and facing something that contradicts your experiences.
 - Example statement from a student "Why don't you know?" Showing kids that we don't have the answers and that we help them ask better questions.
