What can parents do?

- √ Write down and share your concerns with your child's teacher.
- √ Go over the work your child brings home.
- √ Check that homework is done correctly.
- √ Share ideas with the teacher that work for your child.
- √ Notify the teacher of new developments (medical, family issues, etc.).
- √ Discuss your child's day with them every evening.
- √ Spend time reading together with your child everyday.

What is SRBI/SRBE?

Scientific Research Based Interventions/Enrichment

Teachers, administrators, and families want all children to succeed. There are many ways for students to get additional support at BCS during the school day. We use "Scientific Research-Based Interventions/Enrichment" (SRBI/SRBE) to help our students achieve success.



SRBI/SRBE Mission

We believe that through research-based instruction and targeted intervention/enrichment all students will be successful learners. With parents as our partners, we want to meet the needs of those students who require extra support. Through collaboration, our goal is to provide students with educational opportunities to reach their fullest potential.

SRBI/SRBE Process

The teacher has concerns about a student's progress in the classroom.



The teacher discusses the concerns with the parents. Initial request is submitted for a **Case Review**.



The team meets with the teacher to develop appropriate approaches and strategies to address the needs of the student.

An "intervention/enrichment" plan is created.



The strategies are implemented in the classroom and monitored by the teacher for an agreed upon time frame.



At the end of this period, the team and the teacher meet to review the student's progress and determine next steps.

What is a Case Review?

A Case Review is a team meeting designated for teachers to collaborate with colleagues to address specific student needs.

Case Review Meetings

- Performs below/above benchmark in academic areas.
- Requires support organizing or completing work.
- Demonstrates difficulty expressing or understanding oral language.
- Demonstrates difficulty following classroom routines and expectations.
- Requires support to maintain positive interactions with peers.



Who is on the Case Review Team?

- Literacy/Numeracy Specialists
- Intervention teachers
- Special Education teachers
- Principal / Curriculum Director
- Guidance counselor
- Physical/Occupational therapist

- School Psychologist
- Talented and Gifted Teacher
