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### **INTRODUCTION**

Dear Bethany Community Member,

On behalf of the Bethany Public School District, we are pleased to present the District's Strategic Plan for 2020-2025. This Plan lays out our values and vision for the development of the District over the coming years.

The District serves approximately 370 students, PreK-Grade 6, and is dedicated to excellence for and by all. This Strategic Plan builds upon this legacy, while providing clear direction for the future.

Developing this Plan was a collaborative effort, led by a committee that included members of the Board of Education, school administration, teachers, staff, and school parents. The Strategic Planning Committee began its work in January 2019. The Committee collected input from stakeholders in the school and community. It generated a revised Mission Statement encapsulating the District's core values and identified key goals in four major areas: Curriculum and Instruction, Culture and Climate, Community Engagement, and Future-Ready Facilities. In August 2019, the Strategic Planning Committee passed the baton to the Bethany Community School Steering Committee, consisting of educators and administrators at the Bethany Community School, which worked over the next several months to identify and prioritize specific action steps in the service of each goal. The Strategic Planning Committee put their final stamp of approval on the plan in January 2020 and sent it to the Board of Education for review and approval.

This 5-Year Strategic Plan provides an overarching framework for ongoing development and improvement, supporting and building on the outstanding work that is already happening in the District. We recognize that we can't accomplish all goals at once; however, we are confident that over time, with continued collaboration, positive relationships, and a commitment to excellence for and by all, our school district will continue to provide a first-rate education for our children and to be a source of pride for the Town of Bethany.

# **CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION**

### **GOAL 1**

- Transition to standards-based reporting<sup>\*</sup> to better assess how students are performing on a set of clearly defined learning outcomes.
- Create, evaluate and refine a high-quality Grade 5 & 6 middle school model<sup>\*</sup>.
- Establish a sixth grade Capstone project\*.
- Promote the humanities by enhancing the visual and performing arts opportunities.
- Research and develop a school-wide homework plan.

### GOAL 2

We will invest in the continual development of our staff.

- Promote personalized learning\* opportunities to advance teaching, learning and the goals of the District.
- Create a school-wide Steering Committee<sup>\*</sup> to drive school improvement through the use of research, development and monitoring of initiatives, and to develop professional development growth plans.
- Ensure the timeliness, effectiveness, and monitoring of training.
- Develop a shared understanding of instructional rounds<sup>\*</sup> and a plan to implement.



### **CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION**

GOAL 3

- Create units of study to support functional daily living skills\*.
- Establish a school-wide common understanding of the elements of digital citizenship and integrate into day-to-day instruction.

### **GOAL 1**

### **GLOSSARY**

#### **Growth Mindset**

"In a growth mindset, people believe that their most basic abilities can be developed through dedication and hard work—brains and talent are just the starting point. This view creates a love of learning and a resilience that is essential for great accomplishment." (Dweck, 2015)

Whether a student holds a fixed mindset or growth mindset significantly impacts their learning experience—from elementary school to high school. Students that hold a fixed mindset give up when they can't solve a problem and admit defeat. This can be detrimental to students' future efforts and leads to limited student growth. With a growth mindset, students continually work to improve their skills, leading to greater growth and ultimately, success. The key is to get students to tune into that growth mindset.

#### **Habits of Mind**

A pattern of intellectual behaviors that leads to productive actions. When we experience dichotomies, are confused by dilemmas, or come face-to-face with uncertainties, our most effective response requires drawing forth certain patterns of intellectual behavior.

#### **Project Based Learning**

A teaching method in which students gain knowledge and skills by working for an extended period of time to investigate and respond to an authentic, engaging, and complex question, problem, or challenge.

### **Standards Based Reporting**

Refers to systems of instruction, assessment, grading, and academic reporting that are based on students demonstrating understanding or mastery of the knowledge and skills they are expected to learn as they progress through their education.

### Middle School Model

Is characterized by structures and approaches that meet the needs of young adolescents and considers the impact on student growth, rather than cross sectional student achievement.

#### **Capstone Project**

A multifaceted assignment that serves as a culminating academic and intellectual experience for students that take a wide variety of forms but most are long-term investigative projects that culminate in a final product, presentation, or performance. Capstone projects are generally designed to encourage students to think critically, solve challenging problems, and develop skills such as oral communication, public speaking, research skills, media literacy, teamwork, planning, self-sufficiency, or goal setting. In most cases, the projects are also interdisciplinary, in the sense that they require students to apply skills or investigate issues across many different subject areas or domains of knowledge.



### **GLOSSARY**

### **Personalized Learning**

Refers to instruction in which the pace of learning and the instructional approach are optimized for the needs of each learner.

### **Steering Committee**

A committee that decides on the priorities and goals of an organization and manages the general course of its operations.

#### **Instructional Rounds**

A process that districts and schools use to better understand teaching and learning in schools in order to improve learning at scale. It is these practices that are shared with the school, not information about individual teachers or students.

#### Social Emotional Learning

The process through which children and adults understand and manage emotions, set and achieve positive goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions.

#### Trauma Informed

Teaching students about stress responses and resilience can help them better recognize their emotions, cope with trauma, and reach out for help before they act out—freeing them from emotional roadblocks so they can learn more readily and thrive in classrooms.

#### **BCS Gets Fit**

A program sponsored by the District Wellness Council that promotes student, staff and family physical and mental health.

#### **Functional Skills**

Skills a special education student needs to live independently in order to gain as much independence and autonomy as possible, whether their disability is emotional, intellectual, physical, or a combination of two or more (multiple) disabilities.

### **Scientifically Research Based Enrichment**

Research-based instruction and targeted enrichment all students will be successful learners. The goal is to provide students with educational opportunities to reach their fullest potential.

#### Eureka!

A service for identified talented and/or gifted students in the fourth, fifth, and sixth grades. Participation is offered to students with outstanding creativity and students with extraordinary learning ability.

#### **Student Success Plan**

An individualized student driven plan that will be developed to address every student's needs and interests to help students stay connected in school and to achieve educational goals.
